## ACTIVE SHOOTER/FIRST RESPONDER

(Nominal Numeric Response)

February 28-29, 2012

At Ventura County Sheriff's Range

9AM – 5PM both days



This is an intensive two day course. It is designed for the realistic expectation of a singular or two-man response to an active shooter. Response times, deployed personnel and other mitigating factors will most probably be the dictating forces behind a low number response. The course will include a combined lecture of tactics, theories, firing solutions, response mechanisms, communications and the physiological and psychological factors faced by the first responder. One day intensive live fire rifle training will be incorporated to allow the participant/police officer to be able to solve complex firing solutions. A second day will be devoted to cold runs from response to contact to resolution in a non-live fire format. Other factors covered during the course will include weapons selection, attendant gear, weapons and gear set up and rapid deployment to known or unknown threats. **Live fire training will be conducted in a rifle format only. Shooters must have a proficient skill in the use of the rifle.**

He also spent several years as an adjunct instructor for the Department of Energy's SRT-III training in New Mexico. Scott is a use of deadly force expert witness in police defense cases for the Superior and Federal Courts and works as a lecturer and consultant on high profile cases for law firms, the District Attorney's office and the U.S. Government. He is the head firearms instructor for International Tactical Training Seminars, Inc. (I.T.T.S.), a private firearms school in Los Angeles.
